

About DLL Learning Networks



Purpose

Learning networks organized by the Development Learning Lab (DLLs) bring together practitioners and researchers with a common thematic interest.

The purpose is to enhance learning by sharing research-based knowledge and practical experience, and thereby contribute to improved development outcomes.

Content

The network focuses on questions that are important to practitioners.

Members of the network are expected to share their knowledge and expertise. Practitioners are expected to share lessons, good and bad, from the implementation of aid projects. Researchers are expected to share research-based knowledge of relevance to the network. This includes summaries of available evidence as well as single studies of particular interest.

External speakers will occasionally be invited to present.

Members of the network are invited to shape the agenda of the network and the content of meetings.

Format and time horizon

The network will have one physical and 1-2 digital meetings per semester. The first physical meeting will be a full day event. Subsequent physical meetings will normally be half-day events and will include a social gathering. The frequency of meetings can be adjusted according to the preferences of the members.

The time horizon of each network is 3 years. Members of the network are encouraged to participate during the entire period to build a trusting learning environment.

Venue

Physical meetings will take place at the Norad office or at other suitable venues in Oslo.

Participation

The network is open to anyone working in a Norwegian civil society or research organizations. Participation is free of charge.
